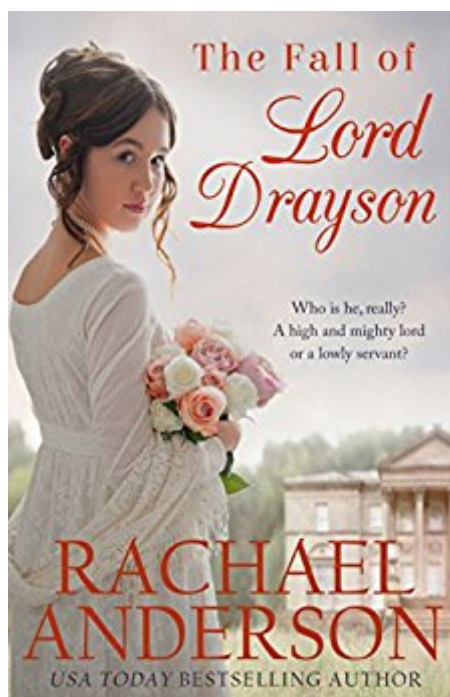


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The Fall Of Lord Drayson (Tanglewood Book 1)

I have loved Rachel Anderson's romantic comedies, and was very excited to see that she was branching out into regency romance. The Fall of Lord Drayson did not disappoint. When Colin Cavendish, Lord Drayson, arrives at the dower home of Tanglewood to tell its occupants of his

Itâ™s not like I want All of it written out but I think sometimes characters fall in love without really getting to know each other or leaving the reader to assume that they have. Maybe I just like sarcasm and knowing what is really going on in their head. I also enjoyed Lucyâ™s determination to tell the truth and yet how her anger gets her into so much trouble. She really wars with honesty and the political correctness of polite society. I appreciated Mrs. Biddings demonstration in true friendship to Lucyâ™s mother which is rare no matter the time period and peoples natural desire to gossip. This is a clean read and may have a few tempting kisses but his honor and integrity keeps him from treating her as less than a lady and himself as less than a gentleman. Rarely does a quote at the beginning of a book fit and continually tie in as well as this one does. (Cryptic, right) What I didnâ™t likeâ | I felt teased by the identity of Mr. Ludlow, Lady Drayson, and Harriett. I hope that there is another book in the works that will feature them more. I would love to have had the hat tied in better at the end. Hat? Yes, hat. You will just have to read the book to find out.

Another sweet novella with enchanting personalities and misunderstandings as their friendship grows into something much more lively. Lucy is shaken to her core when Lord Drayson, the new owner of Tanglewood, stops by to inform her mother that they must vacate the dower house immediately as Tanglewood is being sold. He is very forceful and uncaring in his delivery as Lucy tries to inform him that his father agreed they could live in the dower house as long as they needed. The son informs her there was no signed agreement and so with his father's death the use of the dower house was no longer binding. In his haste to leave the most disagreeable young woman, he is involved in a riding accident just down the road from Lucy's residence. As she and her only servant, Georgiana, drag his half frozen body back to the dower house, she realizes he does not know who he is. Her mother will be away for two weeks and she decides to exact a bit of revenge on the horrid, Lord Drayson. Lies and more lies build as the daughter of the late vicar begins to build

a whole new life for Collins, her new servant. The personalities clash even as servant and mistress. Funny novella that is delightful.

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
